CLAY EXPLORERS

Below is a structured pottery program designed for 4-year-old preschoolers. The program is segmented into three terms, each consisting of eight **30-minute** lessons. Each lesson includes a creative title and expected learning outcomes to ensure engaging and educational experiences.

Term 1: Introduction to Clay

Lesson	Title	Activity Description & Outcome
1	Clay Play Day	Children explore the feel of clay, learning basic techniques of rolling and pinching. Outcome: Familiarity with clay texture and basic handling skills.
2	Shape Safari	Kids create simple shapes (circles, squares) using clay. Outcome: Recognition and creation of basic geometric shapes.
